The application for a patent should be filed with the Commissioner of Patents, and the fee for the application should be paid at the time of filing.

The Commissioner of Patents will examine the application and will issue a patent if he is satisfied that the invention is new and useful.

The Commissioner of Patents will also issue a certificate of copyright if the applicant is entitled to the same.

The fee for a certificate of copyright is \$2.00.
