The armies of freedom are pressing forward. Paris, Brussels, Stalingrad, Athens and Belgrade are free. But Warsaw, the first city to be enslaved, still waits and endures.

For five terrible years there has been no respite from the agony of Warsaw. Alongside their menfolk, the women of Warsaw have been shot and tortured, have been buried in the rubble of their homes, have watched their children die of famine and disease, and have suffered and died in tens of thousands in the torture camps of the Nazi conquerors.

No child has been too young to be spared the twisted malice of German savagery. No woman has been too frail for the death camp and the torture chamber.

By films and by the spoken word something of the epic story of Poland and its martyred capital will be told in London on December 6th. The loveliness of Poland and the tragedy of Warsaw, the splendour of human courage and the depths of human endurance, the heroic grandeur and the grim suffering of a determined and enduring people - these are the themes of this meeting.

A woman who has come from the Polish Underground Movement will speak of the struggle of her people. In turn, the women of London can pay tribute to the women of Warsaw who have suffered and endured so much for our common cause.
