Ed Wegrzyn's 624 Paces Drummond In IBA Tourney

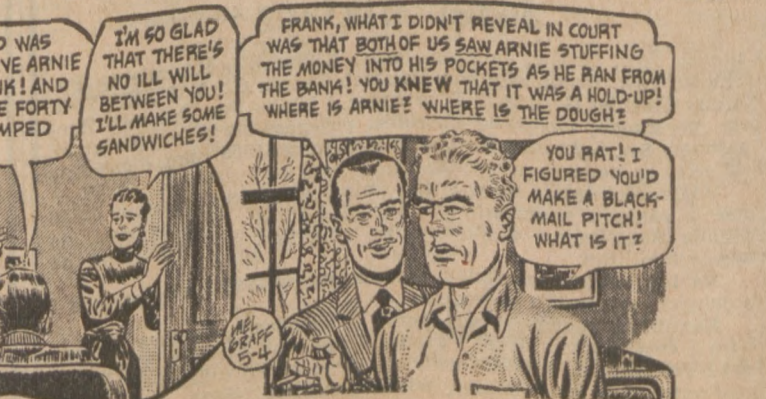

It's A Big Baby Boy For Mr.-Mrs. Chromy-Joe Leon

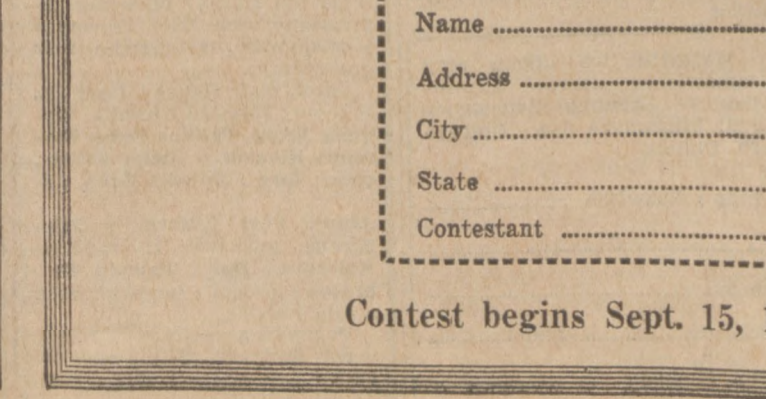
