Second Federal Savings frittered away an early 7 to 0 lead and then unleashed a sizzling offensive which eventually subdued the Drifters, 21 to 9, last Friday evening at Eckhart Park, thereby hoisting them into sole possession of first place in the E. John Sierocinski PNA Senior Softball League race, one game ahead of Curly's Tap Cadets, who were bowing before the hitherto winless Craftsmen, 13 to 7.

Pitcher Jim Bondmass of the Federals was solved for 17 hits by the others as he won his 2nd game against 1 loss. Frank Jarosz and Rabbit collared 3 hits apiece, and Ed Koester, Frank Salkowski, Ken Schlieben and Ken Zech 2 each. The Federals collected 30 bingles off the slinging of Leroy Bobrowski (2-2).

Dale Diezel and Ted Hoffman punched out 5 apiece, Ed Thomas 4, and Gene Mozdierz, Lou King, Jerry Sikorski and Bondmass 3 apiece. One of Diezel's smashes was a 3-run homer in the 1st inning.

Brilliant fielding by King in left, Diezel in center, Thomas in right, and Mozdierz at shortstop also highlighted the struggle which produced one double play by each team.

Mozdierz drew life on an error, King, Stan Logisz and Ted Hoffman singled to produce 2 runs, and Diezel unloaded his 3-run homer to right-center as the Federals led by 5 to 0 at the end of the 2nd.

They boosted it to 7 to 0 in the second on singles by Bondmass and Mozdierz, and King's triple to right-center.

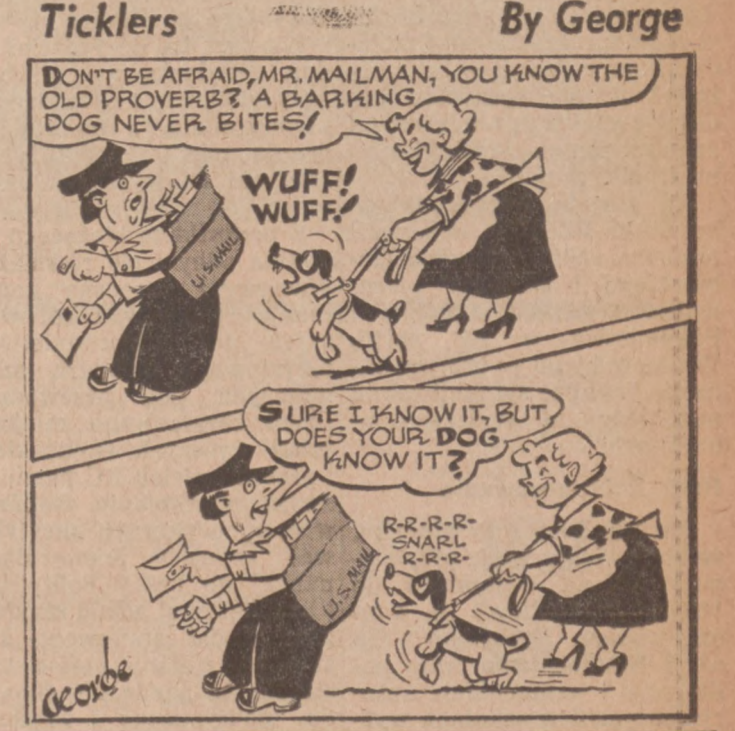
