Jupiter — U. S. Army & U. S. Air Force. By JAMES H. WINCHESTER, Central Press Writer. A surface-to-surface intermediate range ballistic missile, the Jupiter has a range of approximately 1,500 miles. It is 60 feet high, 105 inches in diameter, and has a self-contained, all-inertial guidance system.

The Jupiter, although developed by the Army, in its IRBM stage, comes under the operational control of the Air Force. Air Force personnel are now being trained to handle the weapon in the field.

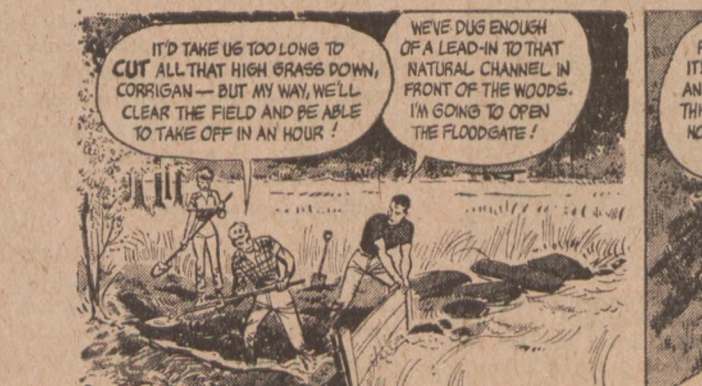
