A. L. Seeks 2 New Cities For 1962

New York, (UPI) — Committed to expand to 10 teams by 1962, the American League began searching for their two new cities today with the New York Yankees still insisting that one of them should be Los Angeles.

President Dan Topping of the Yankees has taken the stand that the American League must be allowed into Los Angeles if the National League returns to New York.

Both the American and National Leagues voted to expand to 10 teams at a joint meeting in Chicago, Aug. 2, and A.L. officials yesterday voted unanimously to add their two clubs no later than the 1962 season.

American League president Joe Cronin said his circuit would work in close cooperation with the National League and added, "I'm hoping everything can be amicably settled."

Topping and his partner, Del Webb, who is chairman of the A.L. realignment committee, have both said they would welcome a National League club in New York. They have even offered to rent Yankee Stadium to such a team, but both Topping and Webb are opposed to the idea that the city of New York should build a new stadium for an incoming team.

Green Bay Packers, Dallas Texans Impress In Pro Exhibition Games

Maybe it's time to start taking the Green Bay Packers and Dallas Texans seriously. The Packers, their five-year plan running far ahead of schedule, ripped off their third straight exhibition victory during the weekend, beating the Chicago Bears, 35-7, to come to age in the National Football League.

The Texans, meanwhile, weren't exactly standing around counting their change as they made the Denver Broncos their fifth straight victims, 48-0, to take the favorite's role in the new American Football League which opens for good next week.

When Vince Lombardi took over as general manager and head coach of the Packers before the start of the 1959 N.F.L. season he vowed that Green Bay would be a contender within five years.

For a start, the Packers improved on a 1-10-1 1958 record by winning seven of 12 games. Their resurgence caused quite a ripple in the Western Division ranks, and speculation began a few weeks ago that they would be in the middle of the division race this year with the world champion Baltimore Colts and Bears.

So far, they've made the experts look good, beating the Pittsburgh Steelers and New York Giants before crushing the Bears. Bart Starr and Lamar McHan, Green Bay's two quarterbacks, completed 16 of 34 passes between them for 312 yards to make a shambles of the Chicago defense.

With a partisan crowd of 35,118 looking on at Milwaukee, Starr connected on a 41-yard pass to Jim Taylor and on a 22-yarder to Max McGee to build up a 17-7 halftime lead and the Bears never recovered. Paul Hornung, the N.F.L. scoring champion last year, added two field goals and three extra points, while McHan connected on a 75-yard pass-run play with Taylor.

TEXANS TAME BRONCOS The Texans, who face a tough battle with the rival Dallas Cowboys for the patronage dollar in a town that is used to winners only, finally had to call on their reserves to keep from running up the score against the Broncos (0-4) with a crowd of 5,300 looking on at Little Rock, Ark.

Park District Football Schools Open September 7

Kickoff time is near for the largest junior football program in the country. The Chicago Park District will open its 24th annual season for football schools at 12 parks throughout the Chicago area Wednesday, September 7. Nearly 2,500 youngsters took part in the 1959 program.

The schools' aim is to teach young boys the fundamentals of good football. Each school has a staff of well-trained instructors, many of whom are volunteers from the park community who donate their time free.

Classes will be held every Monday, Wednesday and Friday between 4 and 6 p.m. At the close of the school each park participating in the program will give merit awards to the youngsters completing the course and will select 22 of its outstanding boys under 14 years of age to represent the park in regular play.

Any youngster under 16 who wishes may attend the school but to be eligible for the team a boy must be 12 or 13 years of age and weigh between 85 and 110 pounds.

Stan-Wal Tap PNA Bowlers Launch New Bowling League Season Sept. 7

The 1960-61 edition of the Stan-Wal Tap PNA bowling team will inaugurate its new season on Wednesday evening, September 7, at Turner Bowl, 6500 W. Belmont Ave. in Northwest Tavern league competition.

Captained by Wally Cabaj, former PNA baseball, basketball softball and golfing standout, the Stan-Wal combo expects to make a strong bid for the loop championship which eluded them last season when a series of injuries and illnesses prevented the squad from presenting its full lineup during the greater portion of the campaign.

Cabaj compiled a nifty 179 mark during 1959-60 and has been working out frequently on local keg lanes in order to surpass his excellent performances of the past. Stan (Strike) Magiera, who authored several outstanding games and series last year, has his mineralite working in high gear and is looking forward to unleashing a withering attack on the maples. He averaged 170 last season.

Another 170-averager, Wally Chimak, has been flashing sparkling form in pre-season exhibition games and should prove an integral part in the Stan-Wal team's bid for the title. Bob (Bullets) Madura, who displayed flashes of stardom during the waning weeks of the 1959-60 campaign, has assured the Messrs. Stanley and Walter Cabaj, that he will rank among the Northwest Tavern league's top-notch bowlers in the games to come.

And Chester (Jake) Onopa, who keeps in shape by plying his craft as professional decorator in great style, hopes to approximate his weight (190) in bowling average. His right arm is in supple form (bearing down on the mahogany at the 3750-52 N. Central Ave. sportsman's rendezvous) and he should prove another valuable asset in his team's championship drive.

Spahn Wins 17th As Braves Blank Cards

Maybe the Milwaukee Braves aren't going anywhere, but Warren Spahn is—straight into the Hall of Fame. Spahn, who won't need any road map to get to Cooperstown, N.Y., when his playing days are over, keeps moving closer to the baseball shrine each time he pitches.

The amazing 39-year-old southpaw already holds the National League record for most 20-game seasons by a left-hander, Spahn has won 20 games 10 different seasons. And he looks like a cinch to make it 11.

Setting the St. Louis Cardinals down, 10-0, on five hits Tuesday night was his 17th game of the season and turned in his 50th shutout along with the 284th victory of his career. He now has won nine games and lost only one since the All-Star break and shows nary a sign of slipping.

The Braves, who moved back into second place by one percentage point over the Cards but still trail the first-place Pirates by 6½ games, handed Ernie Broglio his seventh defeat against 16 victories. They got to him for their first three runs, added four for Ronnie Kline in the seventh and picked up three more in the eighth when Hank Aaron hit his 34th homer with two on off rookie Ed Bauta.

Pittsburgh defeated Los Angeles, 5-2, San Francisco edged Philadelphia, 2-1, and Chicago topped Cincinnati, 5-4, in other N. L. games.

The top three American League clubs all won to cause no change there. New York nipped Kansas City, 3-2, to protect its 1½ game lead over second-place Baltimore, which beat Cleveland, 4-1, and third-place Chicago battled to a 10-inning 11-10 victory over the Washington Senators. Boston swept a twi-night doubleheader from Detroit, 5-4, in 15 innings and 3-2 in 10 innings.

Back-to-back homers by Dick Groat and Roberto Clemente provided the Pirates with their margin of victory over the Dodgers. Bob Friend won his 14th game against 11 losses but Elroy Face had to rescue him when the Dodgers rallied for two runs in the eighth.

Ernie Banks' 37th homer in the ninth inning off Joe Nuxhall led the Cubs to their win over the Reds. Banks' blow brought his runs-batted-in total to 104 and enabled reliever Joe Schaffernoth to gain his second victory.

The White Sox came up with five runs in the ninth and four more in the 10th in their victory over the Senators. Nellie Fox doubled home two runs in the 10th and a wild throw by Bill Gardner enabled the winning run to score. Although the Senators made it close by retaliating with three runs in their half of the 10th, Jim Lemon, Minnie Minoso, Lennie Green and Gardner hit homers. Dick Donovan was the winner and Rudy Hernandez the loser.
