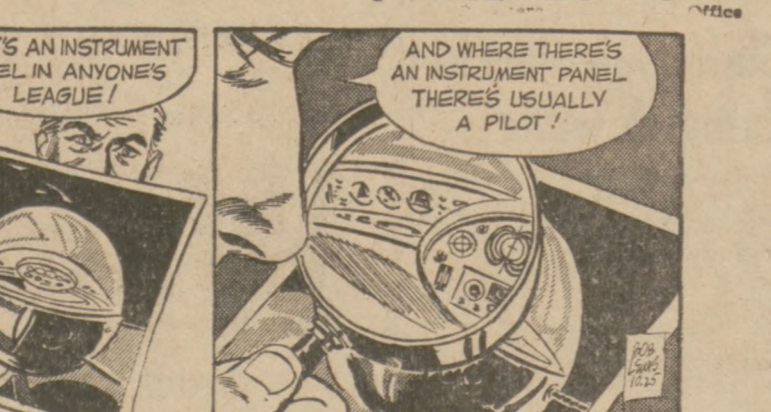

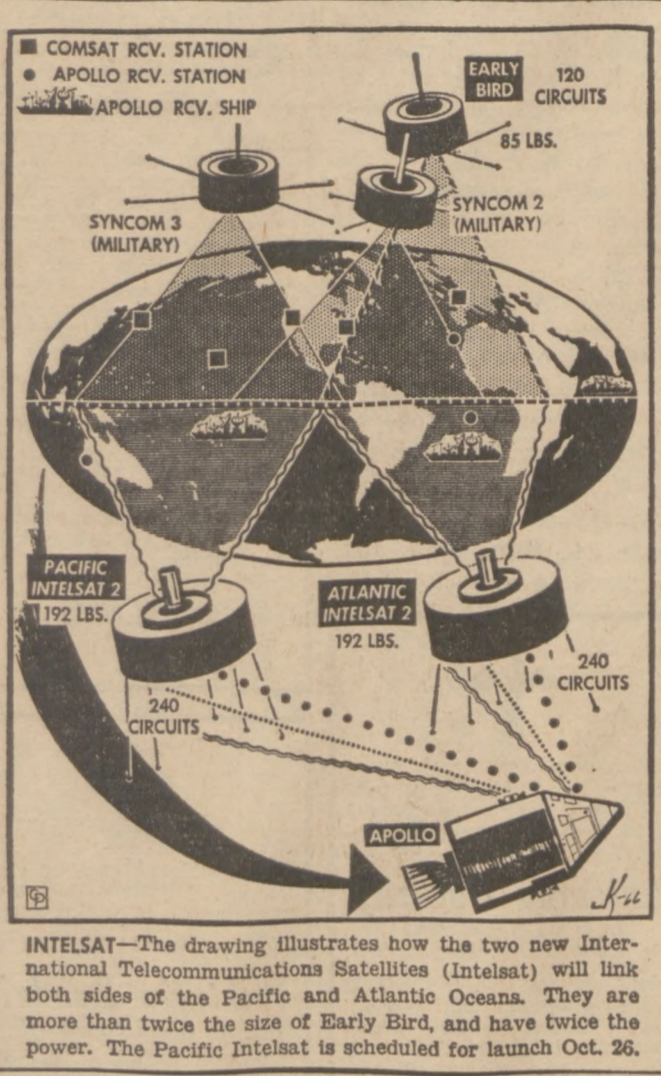

Poles Pioneered In American Industry

In 1608, twelve years before the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth Rock, Poles arrived in John Smith's Jamestown Colony. As industrious as the many Polish immigrants who came in the late 19th century, these "Polanders" delighted Captain Smith by starting the first industries on the Atlantic seaboard: the making of glass, soap, pitch and tar.

An equally significant contribution to the American way of life by these Virginia Poles was the staging in 1619 of the first strike on these shores. They closed down their factories and refused to work until they had been granted the right to vote for representatives in the Virginia House of Burgesses. They won that right.

POLES ALSO settled in the 17th-century Swedish and Dutch colonies of Delaware and New Jersey. Three outstanding men of that period were Dr. Alexander Curtius (Kurojusz), who opened the first high school in New Amsterdam, Albert Zaborowski, founder of the distinguished Zabreckie family and a prominent businessman and developer of northern New Jersey, and Charles Blazkiewicz, who made the first map survey of the New England coast.

One of the first pioneers to cross the Alleghenies was Anthony Sadowski, who opened a trading post at Allegheny (now Pittsburgh) in 1729. Later he traded with the Indians on the Lake Erie site of Sandusky, Ohio. Anthony's sons, James and Jacob, were among early explorers of the Ohio valley and helped found Harrodsburgh, the first settlement in Kentucky.

WHEN THE AMERICAN colonies rebelled and declared independence from England, a number of Polish army officers crossed the Atlantic and offered their services. Among these were Casimir Pulaski and Thaddeus Kosciuszko (kosh-CHOOSH-ko). Pulaski organized, led and personally financed the first American Cavalry. He lost his life in a brave assault in the siege of Savannah in 1779. Kosciuszko has been called both the "father of the U.S. Army Engineer Corps" and the "father of the American artillery." He built the strategic fortifications at West Point, N.Y. and entrenched Gen. Gates' army at Saratoga in what became the decisive battle of the Revolutionary War.

THIS GREAT POLISH patriot — who later led a gallant but ill-fated uprising against Russian occupation of his native land in 1795 — might also be regarded as the pioneer American emancipator. When Congress awarded him land in Virginia for his services to the Revolution, he asked Thomas Jefferson to sell the properties and use the money to buy the freedom of slaves. Jefferson called Kosciuszko the "purest son of liberty among us."

WHEN MORE POLES came to America after the unsuccessful uprising of 1831, they showed the same same devotion to the ideals of freedom. Ernestine Louise Potowska-Rose, a pioneer in the fight for women's rights, also devoted much time to speaking for the freeing of Negro slaves. Other Polish American abolitionists were T. Lewinski, who helped Cassius Marcellus Clay

Red Mismanagement New Restaurant Again Foils Poles In Warsaw

Warsaw (NYT) — A ray of hope that flickered briefly over Polish gastronomy appears to have been extinguished.

For those who eat in Warsaw's restaurants, the recent news that a Hungarian restaurant would open in downtown Warsaw — named of course, the Budapest — raised the long-forgotten prospect of actually looking forward to eating lunch or dinner out. Hungary has earned a reputation for being a good country to feed in.

But one hopeful diner at the new restaurant was sorely disappointed. It was not the food that was bad, but that he never got any.

POLAND WAS a good country to eat in before World War II. The standard explanation is that restaurantrats then were for the privileged classes only. The newly enfranchised, however, complain as despectively about the food and service as do those who knew the prewar splendor of Warsaw eating places.

Eating out in Poland requires patience, a sturdy stomach and patience. The wait for a table is followed by the wait for a waiter to take the order. Often the waiter will not wait until the whole meal has been ordered.

HAVING ANNOUNCED his choice of soup, the customer is likely to find that the waiter has disappeared before the other courses can be ordered. Experienced diners memorize the whole meal order and recite it in a flat, rapid monotone hoping to hold the waiter's attention through his choice of dessert.

Losing the waiter means a wait after the soup for the meat. This wait can be considerable. And unless the check is called for midway through the meal, the postprandial wait is no shorter.

DESPITE IMPOSING menus — generally mimeographed booklets signed fearlessly by the top echelon of the kitchen staff — the actual choice of available dishes is less imposing.

Only the dishes that have prices written next to them are available and then only at some time during the day.

When they are ordered, the answer is frequently "Nie ma." This means, literally, "there isn't any." But the tone in which waiters utter this Polish theme song makes "Nie ma" mean that there never has

Asia: Revolution and Ideology

I WILL HERE venture to hope that when that beacon is lit, it will bear, somewhere at the core of its message, the promise of human dignity.

I will venture to hope that the path to that dignity will be illuminated with the incandescence of a sustained, social revolution that will lift men everywhere to a level where they might begin to enjoy the freedom and the privilege to be spontaneous.

WHY MUST land be redistributed? "It is the absolute right of the proletariat," says Das Kapital.

AND WE MIGHT begin with a revision of nomenclature which, to some may seem trivial, but which in fact of its essence of the archaic, paternalistic Euro-centrism which they must uproot.

YOU MIGHT WISH to resolve here as a token of your recognition that the world is round and that there is civilization at every latitude.

THE SCENE — a foreigner can write, the foreigner speaking, as the Spaniards would say, "sin pelos en la lengua," with un-velveted tongue, can happen in very few places in the world today. One of these places is the United States of America. But let me end with a gentle reminder about how versatile the sword of freedom can be. It can cut the bonds of slavery, it can slay the father image, it can hack at the jungle of injustice, to make way for social revolution — and it can also be used for self-destruction.

May God show Americans and all free men the way to wield it, so that mankind may survive — in freedom, yes, but also and above all — in dignity.
