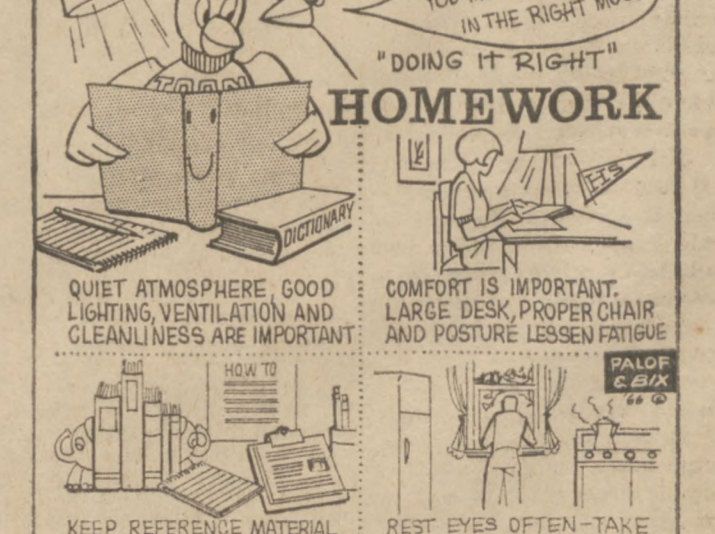

Catholic Univ. Of Lublin Opens New Academic Term

Lublin (IC) — A new academic term opened at the Catholic University of Lublin. The opening ceremonies began with Holy Mass offered in the intention of the whole academic community by Bishop Piotr Kalwa, Grand Chancellor of the University. Bishop Bohdan Sikorski, Ordinary of the Plock Diocese, preached the sermon.

The next part of the ceremonies was held in the university's grand auditorium. Primate Cardinal Wyszyński, Archbishop Antoni Baraniak, Metropolitan of Poznan, seven other bishops, Father Jerzy Tomzinski, General of the Paulines, and a delegation from the Warsaw Academy of Catholic Theology, in the persons of its Rector, Rev. Professor Jozef Iwanicki and pro-Rector Rev. Professor Jan Stepien, attended the inauguration.

Besides the faculty members at the university and many of its students, present also were representatives of other Lublin schools of higher learning, of the Society of Friends of the Catholic University of Lublin, and representatives of the civil authorities in the persons of Dr. W. Kinsowski, vice-director of the Department of University and Economic Studies of the Ministry of Higher Education, and members of the provincial national council.

RECTOR PROFESSOR Wincenty Granat opened the inaugural ceremonies. He informed those present about the text of a telegram sent to the Holy Father in the name of the Primate, the faculty members and the bishops present at the inauguration. Father Granat also read numerous telegrams of good wishes which arrived in connection with the opening of the new academic term. Among them were telegrams from those Polish bishops who were unable to attend, and from the Rector and faculty members of the Catholic University of Milan, Italy.

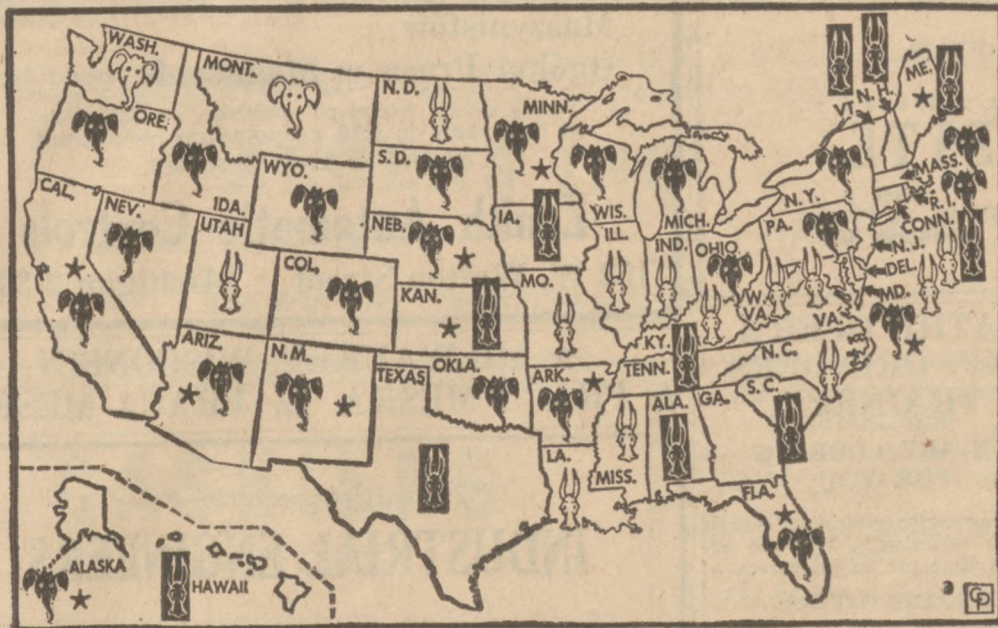
In his address Father Granat spoke about the culture of Christian Poland, so rich and permeated by the ideals of freedom and tolerance; and he recalled the principles

on which the Church — and by the same token the Catholic universities — base their relation to culture. He stated that the principles of the Church's attitude towards human life and culture have been defined precisely in the conciliar constitution "On the Church in the Modern World."

FATHER GRANAT said that the Catholic University of Lublin is a creation of Catholic and Polish culture, and is also an instrument for its further transmission. He emphasized that the University has the ambition of becoming more and more a center where new mental, moral and religious values are shaped, and where they are presented in a form adapted to the thousand-year-old traditions of Poland and to the national character. The academic role of the Catholic University of Lublin is attested to by the numerous prizes received by its faculty members and students, especially historians and those who teach Polish language and literature and classical philology. It is also attested to by the collaboration of the faculty of the Humanities with their counterparts within other universities and scientific societies.

PRO-RECTOR Rev. Professor Zdzislaw Papierkowski presented the report on the activities of the past academic term. This was followed by speeches delivered by representatives of the Society of Friends of the Catholic University of Lublin and representatives of the student body. After singing of "Gaude Mater Polonia" by the academic choir, Rev. Stanislaw Mazierski delivered the inaugural lecture, the theme of which was the contemporary conception of the laws of nature.

PRIMATE CARDINAL Wyszyński spoke before the closing of the inaugural ceremonies. In his address he concentrated on the problem of the mutual respect which should be the mark of both of the students toward the professors and the professors toward the students.

Frustration Spreads Irish Temper Is Aroused Over New Immigration Law

(Editor's note: — Revised for cutting down the number of entries also from Great Britain and other Western European countries. Asked whether the creation of the Irish committee here indicated that the New York area was the main target of visa applicants in Ireland, Mr. Marks remarked, "Quite possible — we have here more of everything in New York.")

WHY DON'T THE Irish in New York help relatives in the old country to obtain immigration visas? "You would think there are enough Irish people around here to do the same for their kinsfolk as the Italians do for theirs," John P. Collins, a member of the Limerick Association and chairman of the new American-Irish Immigration Committee, said yesterday. "However, the pattern of Irish immigration to the United States and the structure of the Irish family are different."

MR. COLLINS pointed out that Irish immigrants did not tend to bring in their entire families, including their parents, the way immigrants from Southern Europe traditionally did. The new American-Irish committee would pressure the Administration and legislators, Mr. Collins declared, to reduce the number of job classifications that are considered undesirable. The committee planned also to give assistance to Irish visa applicants who were in trouble.

The new committee, still in formation, so far comprises representatives of the United Irish Countries Association, the Gaelic Athletic Association, the Ancient Order of Hibernians, the Irish Institute and several country groups. Mr. Collins said 696 Irish immigrants had come into the United States in the first seven months after the new legislation became operative, as against 2,300 immigrants in the comparable period a year earlier.

Under the obsolete quota system, 17,756 immigrant visas were assigned to Ireland every year, but the number was never reached.

HE SAID THAT Irish immigration was hampered above all by the new immigration law's Section 212 (a) (14), under which skilled and unskilled alien workers must receive a certification from the United States Department of Labor that they will not have an adverse effect on the labor economy.

TO IMPLEMENT this, the Labor Department issued a prohibited entry list of unskilled occupational titles containing 49 job descriptions. Irish pressure has prompted the Labor Department to remove 16 of these job titles from the prohibited list so far, and he removal of many more is being sought, community spokesmen said yesterday.

APPLICANTS in many labor categories must prove now that they have job offers in the United States, and obtaining Labor Department certification that in individual applicant would not adversely affect the economy often proves cumbersome, it was explained.

However, Federal officials have recently indicated that the labor clearance rules may be relaxed soon, allowing hospital workers, artisans and other immigrants with skills in short supply here to enter without job offers.

Off-Campus Work Orchard Lake Priests Give Lectures

Orchard Lake, Mich. (Sp.)—Two Orchard Lake Schools faculty members are engaged in teaching activities off the campus. They are Rev. Anthony Kosnik and Rev. Valerius Jasinski. What You Should Know About Guarantees

New York. (NAPS) — While most people wouldn't make a major purchase without receiving some sort of guarantee on the product, there's a widespread lack of knowledge about what a guarantee is, what it isn't, and just what to look for when offered a guarantee.

Take the case, for example, of one lady who went in to get a replacement for her "Lifetime Guaranteed" muffler which had burned out. She wasn't given a new one, however, since the guarantee was for the lifetime of the muffler — not the lifetime of the car or of the lady!

BUT THE TIP in this story may help you avoid such incidents, and make you a smarter shopper.

Essentially, a guarantee is a promise to make good in case something unforeseen happens to the thing you buy. There are four main questions, listed by researchers at Monsanto Company's Chemstrand Division, that you should keep in mind when you're evaluating any guarantee: (1) What has to happen? (2) During what interval of time after purchase? (3) Who will make good? (4) In what way?

SOME GUARANTEES promise that the guarantor will make good if you discover a mechanical defect in the product that existed at the time you bought it. Others promise to make good in the event that what you bought stops functioning properly.

The second guarantee is much better, for it's easier to prove that a product just stopped working than to prove that it stopped because of an inherent mechanical defect.

If the first type of guarantee is offered to you by a reputable dealer, it's probably a subtle hint that you may be buying too cheap a product. A \$3.95 watch may be free of mechanical defects, but that doesn't mean that a part can't wear out in two weeks. Only a "function" guarantee can protect you from such eventualities. But if you get one, be sure it covers the whole product and not just a part.

THE GUARANTEE slip should always tell you for how long the guarantee is good. Be sure to read the fine print. If a guarantee says at the top in bold letters, "Ten Year Guarantee," but then goes on to say, in smaller print, that the guarantor will fix the product free if something goes wrong with it during the first 30 days after purchase, you may find that you have to pay the full repair cost if anything goes wrong during the remainder of the ten year period. In other words it's really a 30-day guarantee.

You're safe if you have it in writing that a product is unconditionally guaranteed for a definite period of time. For example, a full year of normal wear is guaranteed by Chemstrand for men's and boy's slacks and jersey sports shirts made with Acrilan and identified by Wear-Dated hang tags.

IF WEAR-DATED shirt or pair of slacks fails to give you a year of normal wear, you can get a refund or a replacement from Chemstrand by returning the item to your local dealer along with the sales slip and the Wear-Dated hang tag.

You don't have to worry if you deal with a reputable local dealer, or if you buy a well-advertised national brand. But if you buy a known brand from a little-known dealer, be sure you understand the "factory guarantee" he shows you.

IN SOME CASES, the factory will make good only if the merchandise is bought from an authorized dealer. In almost all cases, the factory guarantee covers only the product, the factory won't make good if the dealer does a faulty installation job.

If the product you buy is a mechanical one, the guarantee may cover the parts, labor or both — or is may cover neither. Find out for sure.

A GUARANTEE to repair a product at no charge if something goes wrong may be better than the promise of a "free" replacement. If a company offers you a guarantee to repair the product, you know two things: (1) that the company thinks its product is so good that it won't need repairs or replacement for at least the guarantee period; (2) that if it does, you're safe — the company will fix it for nothing. The best guarantee is usually one where the company will either repair or replace a product, depending on what is needed.

BY KEEPING these facts about guarantees in mind whenever you go out to make a purchase, you'll probably stretch your shopping dollar by getting more for your money and avoiding costly outlays for replacements and repairs.

Winter Humidity Needs Attention

New York (UPI) — Heat and humidity, bugaboos of summer, concern the homeowner in winter, too, although in different combination.

For a home to be properly "air conditioned," not just heated in winter or cooled in summer, a proper humidity level should be maintained at all times, regardless of whether it means the addition or removal of moisture from the environment.

And, increasingly, homeowners are coming to feel the really complete home conditioning system repair filter which can provide pure air, in addition, an electronic air in the home at least, no matter what the state of outdoor air pollution.

"It is a known fact," according to the Climate Control Council, "that people are more conscious of discomfort from humidity problems during the summer. Throughout the summer people say 'it's not the heat, it's the humidity,' and, essentially, they are correct."

IN THE WINTER, however, the Council says, "this awareness does not generally exist. This is because insufficient humidity — winter's problem — makes itself felt in more subtle ways than does too much of it."

In winter, as well as in summer, however, comfort is a product of temperature and humidity. With lower humidities, higher temperatures are required to give the desired comfort conditions. By raising the humidity in a given area, within reasonable limits, temperature can be lowered, resulting in more economical operation of the heating system and lower fuel bills.

In addition, it is generally recognized, respiratory difficulties, chapped and itching skin and similar conditions often are alleviated when dry winter air is humidified. Aside from health considerations, inadequate humidity is detrimental to books, furniture, house plants. While too much moisture is harmful, of course, too little can damage possessions by allowing them to dry out.

WARM AIR CAN hold more moisture than cold. Therefore, if winter air, which holds less moisture to begin with, is heated within the home, the relative humidity drops unless moisture is added to compensate for the rise in temperature.

As knowledge of winter humidification increases, more and more homeowners are equipping their homes with mechanical humidification — either the built-in central humidifiers which can be used with ducted, warm-air heating systems or a variety of portable models which make it possible to humidify any house or apartment.

FOR REALLY "purifying" a home's air — removing smoke, dust, pollen, other allergy-causing irritants — the electronic filter is the answer; again, either a central system or, where this is not feasible, a portable unit. Such filters now, according to the National Warm Air and Air Conditioning Association, are so efficient that particles of smoke or smog as small as 1/250,000th of an inch can be trapped.

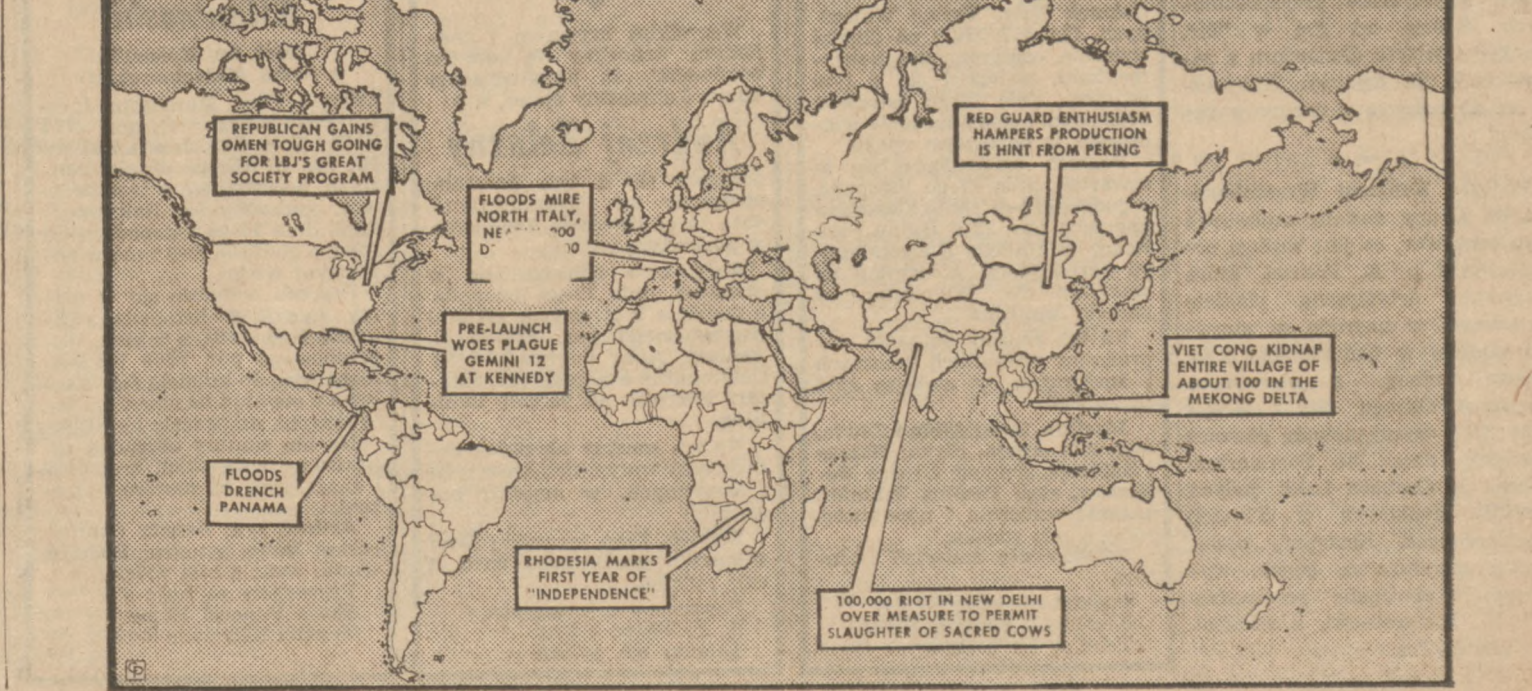
