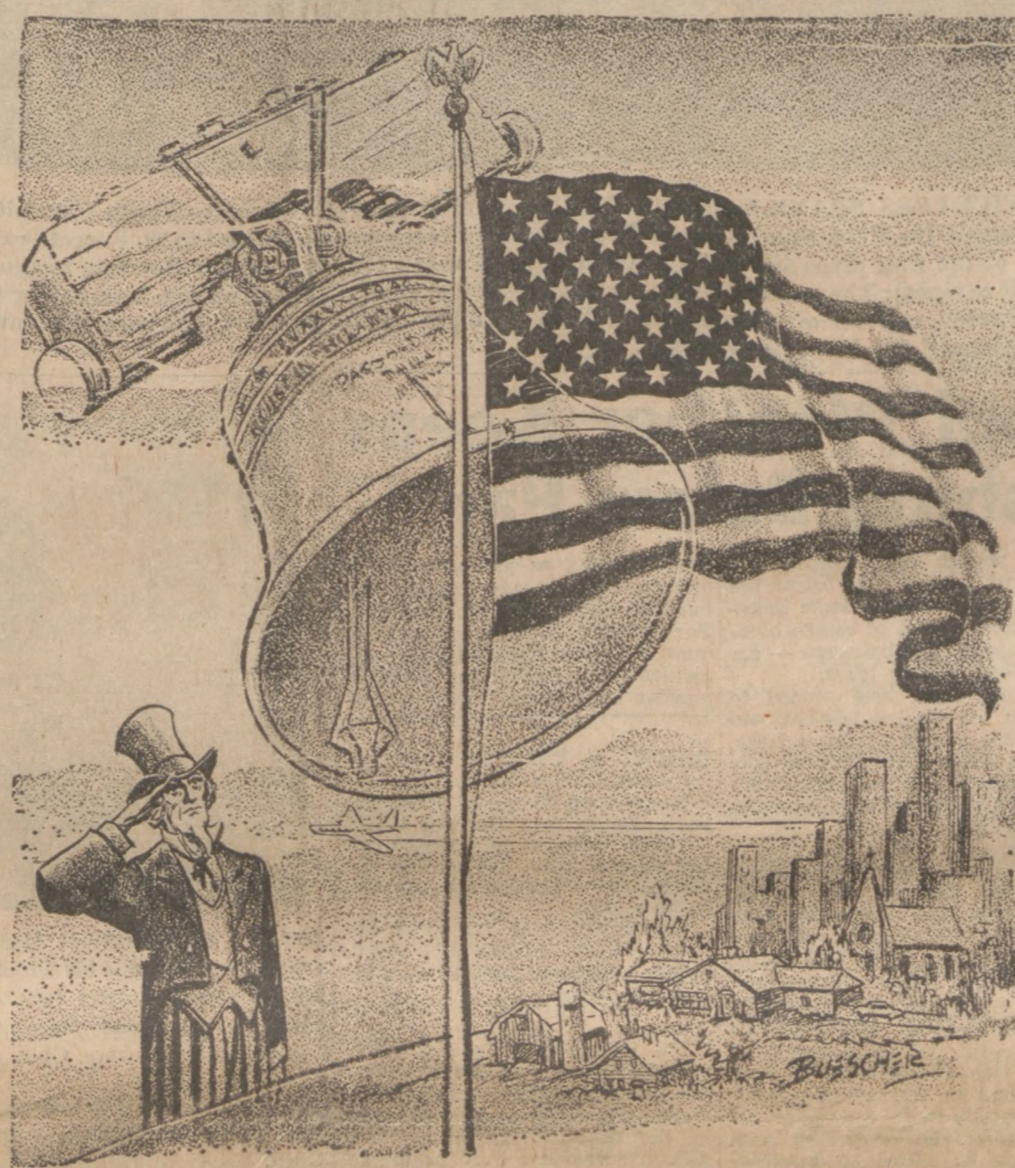

Cool Weather Keeps Fishing Below Par

Even though cool weather has kept local fishing well below par for this time of year, some large-mouth bass — and of course bluegills, crappies, and bullheads — are being taken in area lakes.

San Francisco (UPI)—The Navy finally has sung the praises of a group of unsung heroes of World War II, a handful of yachtsmen who might have become America's first line of defense against the Japanese fleet.

Thirteen Bay Area yachts sailed forth in May, 1942, sure that they would face the guns of the enemy. Only one of them was to be fished upon.

The yachts formed a warning line off the West Coast. They were to flash a radio alert to the mainland if Japanese ships were spotted.

IN THE EARLY days after Pearl Harbor naval authorities indeed felt that the possibility of the message being sent was real. Before the yachts took up their positions 300 miles off the California coast, the Navy relied on a thin warning screen of patrol boats and seagoing tugs.

Luckily, the Japanese headed for Midway where they were beaten by the American fleet on June 4, 1942.

Seventeen of the weekend sailors were honored for the first time recently when the Navy hosted a luncheon for them at Treasure Island Naval Base in San Francisco Bay.

THE TALES the yachtsmen told had elements of comedy but also the determination of the boatmen of England who brought back a battered army from Dunkirk.

The well-kept, seagoing yachts, most of them 50 or 60 foot sloops, were taken to Treasure Island and prepared for what was to be a two-week stay on the high seas.

Sailors tossed a dull gray paint over their gleaming white hulls in an effort to make them less conspicuous.

"But they forgot about the white sails," said Stan Natcher, now general manager of public relations for an oil firm.

THE MOST VIVID recollection of the yachtsmen was of the Navy sailors who rounded out the crews.

"Oh, they were seasick," said Lionel Barneson, 76. Natcher recalled one of his blue-jackets who was sick for the whole two weeks.

Kuniczak, Sheilah Graham On 'Book Beat' TV Program

After the German invasion of Poland in 1939 he escaped to Great Britain and came to the United States in 1950.

In Real Estate Special Bathroom Fixtures Available For The Elderly

Washington (UPI) — America worships youth and tries to ignore old age.

Now, in one area at least, the elderly are beginning to get some attention. It's the bathroom.

For too long, manufacturers of bathroom fixtures have overlooked the fact that old people have a hard time using the same fixtures as the rest of us. The older people get, the harder for them to bend and step and reach.

THE AMERICAN Association of Retired Persons and the National Retired Teachers Association had this problem in mind when they asked American Radiator & Standard Sanitary Corp. to set up a model bathroom for the elderly at its headquarters here in the Dupont Circle building.

Many of the fixtures have been used for years in nursing homes and hospitals, but only recently has the industry begun making them available to the general public.

Many elderly persons might be able to remain independent and out of nursing homes longer, if they had bathroom fixtures designed for them.

THE FACTS DESCRIBED above are comprehensively dealt with in the article entitled "On Either Side of the Wall" by Wladyslaw Bartoszewski, which opens this book. The author of this article is particularly well qualified to write on the subject: on the one hand, as the co-organizer of, and active worker on, the Council of Help to Jews (1942-44) and deputy director of the Jewish section of the Government Delegation (1943-44), he has been decorated by the Martyrs and Heroes Remembrance Authority Yed Vashem in Israel with the medal of "the Righteous among the Nations of the World;" on the other hand, as a historian investigating the history of the German occupation of Poland, Mr. Bartoszewski is the author of numerous publications on, among others, the martyrdom and struggle of Polish Jews and the help offered to them. Zofia Lewin, the co-editor of this book, now an editor at Polish Scientific Publishers (P.W.N.), was active during the German occupation as a teacher in the underground department of education. The daughter of a major of the Polish Army, who was shot by the Germans at the beginning of 1940, she survived the war years thanks to the help of many people of good will, because, though she was a Roman Catholic by birth, brought up in the sphere of Polish culture, her parents were of Jewish origin and she was therefore a potential victim of the Nuremberg Laws.

ABOUT 200 AUTHENTIC accounts written by eye-witnesses of, and actors in, the events described form the bulk of this book. They are stories from those who were helped and those who gave help, and from those who observed with their own eyes how the help was being given. PROMISING OINTMENT FOR SKIN CANCER

A promising development in fighting skin cancer has been reported by Dr. Edmund Klein and associates at Roswell Park Memorial Institute, Buffalo, New York.

Heretofore, to treat multiple basal-cell carcinomas and solar keratosis (a premalignant condition), X-ray, surgery or radium usually have been used. These methods, however, sometimes leave extensive scars. The new treatment is an ointment containing from 5 to 20 percent 5-Dr. Amberson (uro-urocil).

Over a four-year period, in more than 100 patients receiving this medication, nearly 95 percent of basal-cell cancers and an even higher percentage of solar keratoses have disappeared with little or no scarring.

Furthermore, when applied to a large area other than the obvious trouble site, the ointment leaves normal skin virtually unaffected, while early hidden tumors swell up so they can be seen and treated.

About 18 percent of all cancers involve the skin. These skin cancers are not contagious, and cannot be "caught" from another person. Because skin cancer can be seen and diagnosed readily it is simpler to cure than other types of cancer. Cancer of the inner organs, on the other hand, may remain undetected until it has progressed to a considerable extent.

How can you recognize skin cancer? Any skin blemish, sore, or lump which fails to heal, may bleed or look irritated, increases in size, or changes

color would be suspect. If you have a skin lesion with any of these characteristics, consult a physician without delay.

WHAT IS LEUKOPLAKIA? When white patches develop on the tongue and gums, separated by little fissures or paths, the condition is called leukoplakia. It is generally thought to be related to smoking. Your physician will probably advise you to give up smoking. If there is minor discomfort or pain of the cheek or gums associated with leukoplakia, he may recommend an anesthetic oral solution called Chloroseptic that has been found to provide temporary relief of pain involving the gums, cheeks or tongue within seconds.

Leukoplakia should be followed by your physician, since constant irritation may result in cancer. WHY IS GOUT CALLED THE "RICH MAN'S DISEASE"? Probably because an attack of gouty arthritis may be brought on by eating beef, pheasant or other foods high in purines — and in years past, these could be bought only by the rich.

Gout, however, knows no economic barriers . . . nor is it the "playboy's disease." Gout tends to be inherited (rarely by women) and an attack, characterized by swelling and intense pain in a joint like the big toe, may be brought on by emotional stress, excessive chilling or alcohol intake — as well as by eating the wrong things.

Recent studies indicate that, rather than being the rich man's disease, gout may be more accurately termed the "wise man's disease." Statistical studies of gout sufferers show they usually have high IQs and more creative flair than the average.
