### Bears Sign Center, Back

The Bears have signed two more draftees — center Jack Turnbull from Oregon State and defensive back Laverne Dickinson of Southern University.

Turnbull, a tenth round choice, is 6-3, 235 pounds and 22 years old. His home is Santa Barbara, he is married and the father of one son.

Dickinson, selected on the 17th round, is a 6 foot, 190 pounder who transferred to Southern from the University of Wyoming and, as a senior, led the secondary in tackles while intercepting three passes. He is married and resides in Rochester, N.Y.

### Nebraska Grid Star Arrested

Omaha, (UPI) — Johnny Rodgers, University of Nebraska football player star, has been arrested on suspicion of possession of marijuana, the State Patrol said Wednesday.

The State Patrol said that Rodgers, of Omaha, was a passenger in a car stopped by troopers Saturday night in nearby Cass County. Rodgers a junior, earned second team All-American honors last season.

Cass County Atty. James Begley gave no details and would say only that Rodgers was out on bond. Sheriff Fred Tesch said Rodgers' bond was \$150.

## Czechs Dethrone Russians As World Hockey Champions

Prague (UPI) — Czechoslovakian fans jammed famed Wenceslas Square jeering "Shaibu, Shaibu", the slogan of the Russian ice hockey team, after the Czechs ended the nine-year Soviet reign as world champions.

The Czechs edged the Russian team 3-2 last week for the gold medal. Finland scored a 5-4 triumph over Sweden in the other game.

The Russian slogan which the celebrating Czechs jeered translates as "the puck".

SEVERAL persons were arrested near the square—scene of bloody battles during the Russian invasion of Czechoslovakia in 1968. The crowd later was dispersed but police continued heavy patrol of the central city area.

The Russians were a better team in technique and teamwork but they could not match the tremendous spirit that moved the Czechs.

Czechoslovakia got off to a 2-0 first-period lead before a packed house of 14,000 wildly cheering fans on breakaway

goals by Vaclav Nedomansky and Richard Farda. Jaroslav Holik scored the decisive goal at 9:03 of the second after Russia's Alexandre Maltsev tallied at 3:21. The final Russian goal came at 12:40 of the second period.

THE RUSSIANS repeatedly sailed into the Czech zone in the scoreless third period, only to be foiled by goalie Jiri Holecek.

"Luck was with us", Czech coach Vladimir Kostra said diplomatically of the first crown his country has won since 1949. "Both teams are good. Czechoslovakia had good fortune on her side and fought valiantly".

"We like to play an open game", said Soviet team manager Sievolod Brobov, "and we felt pressed by the Czechs' close checking".

At the end of nine games in the 1972 championship series, Czechoslovakia led with 17 points, followed by the Soviet Union with 15, Sweden 10, Finland 8, West Germany 2 and Switzerland 2.

## Abbey Lincoln To Star In "Wedding Band" At Ivanhoe

Sixth Anniversary Production Has Interracial Love Theme

Talented actress Abbey Lincoln has been cast by Ivanhoe Theatre Producer-Director, George Keathley to star as "Julia" in the Chicago Premiere of "Wedding Band" for seven weeks, Thursday, May 11 through Sunday, July 2. Written by Alice Childress, "Wedding Band", deals with the love relationship between a black woman and a white man in South Carolina in 1918. Miss Lincoln, who was born in Chicago, is perhaps best known for her co-starring role opposite Sidney Poitier in "For Love Of Ivy". Low priced previews are scheduled for Tuesday, May 9 at 8:30 p.m., and Wednesday, May 10 at 2 and 8:30 p.m.

When George Keathley first arrived at the Ivanhoe four years ago this coming July, he brought a copy of "Wedding Bands" with him and said, "This is a play I

very much want to do in Chicago". "Wedding Band", which will be the Ivanhoe's Sixth Anniversary production, has been produced only once before and that was at the University of Michigan's professional theatre production in 1966. It starred Ruby Dee as "Julia" and Abbey Lincoln as "Mattie".

Miss Lincoln's first professional engagement as an actress was in the lead role of "Savannah" in the road company production of 'Jamaica'. Her motion picture debut was with Tom Ewell and Jayne Mansfield in "The Girl Can't Help It", and Miss Lincoln won critical acclaim as an actress of great sensitivity in the 1964 film, "Nothing But A Man".

Recently, "The Black Scene", a collection of 15 scenes from the works of Afro-American playwrights, compiled and edited by Miss Childress, was published by DoubleDay-Zenith. She is now working on a novel for young people dealing with drug addiction titled, "A Hero Ain't Nothin' But A Sandwich" to be published by Coward-McCann and Geoghan for January release.

New York (UPI)—Jean Ratelle, No. 3 scorer in the National Hockey League who missed the last month of the season with a broken ankle, has been pronounced ready to rejoin the New York Rangers for the final round of the Stanley Cup playoffs.

Ratelle, who finished the season with 109 points despite being sidelined March 1 when he cracked a bone in his right ankle, ran through a 75-minute scrimmage Tuesday and convinced Coach Emile Francis that he will be ready to go.

### Toaleta Ślubna Panny Młodej

Toaleta ślubna to rzecz tak indywidualna, że trudno narzucić jej jakąś dyrektywę. Dostosowana tak tkanina jak i linia do typu olubienicy, powinna jednak kierować się zawsze jednymi i tymi samymi cechami: wykintną prostotą i nieskazitelną bielą.

Wprowadzie w ostatnich czasach śnieżny strój ślubny musiał ustąpić coś ze swoich niernaruszalnych praw na korzyść srebrnych koronek i innych ozdób. Jednak była to i będzie jedynie fantazja, rzadko kiedy faworyzowana nie bowiem nie jest w stanie zasnąć uroku białego ślubnego stroju.

Wyklucza on w pierwszym rzędzie wszelką biżuterię, — przynajmniej jedno prawo albo perlom prawdziwym albo sztucznym, z którego modelują czepeczki, podtrzymujące welon ślubny. Sam welon, oraz mistrzowskie jego upięcie — to punkt ciężkości stroju ślubnego.

Ze starych, lub nowych, a dostosowanych do okoliczności koronek, wygląda bodaj najpiękniej; jednakże i bogate zwoje artystycznie drapowanego tulu wyglądają prześlicznie i efektownie.

### Pielęgnacja Cery Na Wiosnę

Ślady czerwonych plam na twarzy powstałe podczas zimy nie łatwo usunąć. Wymaga to czasu i cierpliwości, dlatego też należy tę kurację zacząć jak najprędzej, aby cera powróciła do normy.

Przed wszystkim należy myć twarz wylicznie w miękkiej wodzie (zmniejszyć wodę można dodając odrobinę boraksu). Rano ochlapujemy twarz letnią wodą, a wieczorem myjemy łagodnym, przefiltrowanym mydłem. — Codziennie po wieczornym myciu stosujemy okłady przemienne z zimnej i gorącej wody. Niezbyt gruby reżnik lub kawałek lnianego płótna po zamoczeniu w gorącej wodzie i odcisnięciu kładziemy na twarz i pozostawiamy na 1-2 minuty. Następnie natychmiast po usunięciu kompresu gorącego należy położyć na twarz inny reżnik umoczony w bardzo zimnej wodzie.

Zabieg powtarzamy kilkakrotnie (na końcu zawsze powinien być kompres zimny), a po osuszeniu smarujemy twarz maseczką tranową, którą

pozostawiamy na noc. Jeśli po upływie dwóch miesięcy nie nastąpi poprawa, trzeba zwrócić się do lekarza chorób skórnych. — Być może plamy na twarzy są zastarzałe i wymagają intensywniejszej kuracji którą można jednak przeprowadzić tylko pod kontrolą lekarską. Pamiętajmy także, że jeżeli na twarzy występują pojedyncze rozszerzone naczyńka krwionośne — kąpiel naprzemiennych nie wolno stosować. W takim przypadku trzeba zasięgnąć porady lekarza.

Jeśli uda nam się usunąć ślady zacerwienia skóry pamiętajmy, że najważniejszą sprawą jest odpowiednie zabezpieczenie cery w czasie chłódów i podczas zmian pogody. Należy więc zawsze — przed wyjściem na powietrze posmarować twarz tłustym kremem — najlepiej lanolinowym. Wskazówki te powinny być przestrzegane przez wszystkie osoby o cerze suchej, wrażliwej i skłonnej do podrażnień.
